Meeting Notes:

1. Local Partners: the cluster has invited 2 local NGOs to come present their profiles and interest in engagement in CCCM work.
 - TYES – a local NGO working in different IDPs sites since the start of the crisis in Mekelle and Shire, esp. in MHPSS, nutrition, and provision of shelter and NFI with focus on the more vulnerable population groups. Work with Women and Social Affiars, clusters, HQ in Mekelle – offices in Shire and 9 other towns in the region.
 - Estimating around 500k people displaced in Tigray, with particular problems around safety and security, sanitation, water, report of substance abuse, underage sex, GBV, many sleeping in the open, waste management, risk of air and water-borne diseases, MHPSS.
 - Presenting a concept note for engagement in CCCM. To improve coordination and management of IDP sites, the CN focuses on 3 areas of work 1) safety and security is improved – focus on coordination at site level, participation, trainings, 2) environmental hygiene and sanitation improvement, including hygiene promotion and training, working with surrounding services 3) MHPSS – awareness raising, clinical services, community health workers training, case management.
 - TYES will mobilise its over 152 trained volunteers – 60% of which are women, based in all towns across Tigray region. Carried out assessments in IDPs sites in the region – shown the sites to be mostly not managed,
 - IDPs living w host communities not well represented – working towards community approach to coordination and management of IDPs sites.
 - OWCCO: Women and Children Charitable Organization
 - 2014 set up – focus on women empowerment, cp, GBV, working in Tigray and Afar, include Child education – gender mainstreaming,

- Currently: working w IDPs – focus on women and children – 121 – supporting with food and NFIs.
- Work through staff (5 – 1 of which is female) and volunteers (25 – 12 female) – seeing a lot of nutrition problem, more impact by the wars, have set up centres to support women – case management and MHPSS,
- Partners are encouraged to get in touch with local NGOs presented bilaterally.

2. Updates from REACH:

- Assessments were carried out from 3rd to 30th May, with 268 respondents from 134 kebeles in 50 woredas – working with Rapid Assessment WG and inputs from clusters, w 7 partners (1 UN, 4 INGOs, and 2 local NGOs). The assessments set out to ask Key Informants about situation in place of origin, the hard-to-reach areas in place of origin prior to their displacements - primarily through key informants.
- Note that sampling size per woredas are small, and analysis was done at zonal level.
- Preliminary Findings: with analysis done at Zone level: 4 key messages.
 - Displacement very fluid, with multiple movements over the month of May
 - Most have applied various coping mechanism – esp. related to livestock and plantings.
 - Key concerns – health services, communication services, water
 - Protection concerns – GBV for women and girls, conflict-related killings for men; report of increased number of unaccompanied children,
 - Preliminary findings can be requested bilaterally.
- Clusters are invited to contribute/ comment on the tool for future rounds of assessments.

3. Return intention Survey Planning.

- Objective: to understand the overall plan/intention around returns as well as need associated with returns, working with CCCM, Protection, ES/NFI, FSL clusters, with technical support from IOM(DTM)
 - IOM UNHCR OCHA LWF OSSHD ANE SP
- Methodology:
 - 380 HH sample per location with specific % in sites, % in host communities per location (i.e. Mekelle 76 /304; Adigrat 190/190; Abi Adi 152 / 228)
 - 10-12 enumerators per location – est. 5-6 HH per enumerator/day
 - First round of training **9-12noon**– clarification on terms, use of Kobo, **Thursday 15 July** venue to be confirmed. **UN staff should come w smartphones where available/possible.**
- Logistics:
 - The clusters are looking for partners’ support for 36 enumerators, 12 cars, as well as tablets/smart phones for each enumerators
 - Target areas: Abi Adi, Adigrat and Mekelle
 - planned for 2 days initially to target Mekelle (**Friday 16 – Saturday 17**)
