OVERVIEW OF AFFECTED AREAS AND DISPLACEMENT PATTERNS

NORTH GAZA:

Affected Neighborhoods/Geographical Areas:

Beit Hanoun Beit Lahia Jabalia As Salateen

Displacement Patterns:

According to SMC partners, internal displacement within North Gaza is still on-going as residents continue to search for shelter amid the uncertainty triggered by recent escalations.

Observed Movements on April 6, 2025:

• Unknown origin to Beit Lahia: 2,270 individuals

Observed Movements on April 7, 2025:

• Jabalia to Unspecified destination: 20 individuals

Observed Movements on April 9, 2025:

- As-Salateen to Unspecified destination: 104 Individuals
- Jabalia to Unspecified destination: 104 Individuals
- Unknown origin to Beit Lahia: 255 individuals
- Unknown origin to Jabalia: 247 individuals
- Unknown origin to Beit Hanoun: 58 individuals

GAZA:

Affected Neighborhoods/Geographical Areas:

Ash Shati (Beach) Camp | Southern Remal

Displacement Patterns:

According to SMC Partners, displacement within Gaza City is still on-going, with people moving towards central and western Gaza City.

Observed Movements on April 6, 2025:

- Unknown origin to Ash Shati (Beach) Camp: 660 individuals
- Unknown origin to Southern Remal: 1,210 individuals

DEIR AL BALAH:

Affected Neighborhoods/Geographical Areas:

Al-Mu'askar | West of Al-Aqsa Hospital Area | Al-Sawarih Cemetery Area | Al-Baraka | Al-Zawaida Club

Displacement Patterns:

On 07 April, an evacuation order was issued for Deir Al Balah neighbourhoods in Middle Area, instructing residents to move further south to Al Mawasi.

Observed Movements on April 7, 2025:

- Al-Baraka to Unspecified locations: 520 individuals
- West of Al-Aqsa Hospital Area to Unspecified locations: 300 individuals

KHAN YOUNIS:

Affected Neighborhoods/Geographical Areas:

Al-Satar Al-Sharqi Bani Suheila Qizan Al-Najjar Batn As-Sameen Al Amal Al-Buraq Al-Qarara Al Manara Qizan Abu Rashwan Al-Salam

Displacement Patterns:

Displacement from eastern and peripheral areas of Khan Younis is still on-going, with people relocating to west, which according to SMC Partners, has witnessed a significant influx of internally displaced people since the events of March 18th, 2025.

Observed Movements on April 6, 2025:

• Al-Satar Al-Sharqi, Bani Suheila, Qizan Al-Najjar to Al Mawasi: 550 individuals

Observed Movements on April 7, 2025:

- Al-Qarara to South Deir al-Balah: 285 individuals
- Qizan Al-Najjar to Khan Younis Town, Batin Al Samin and Mawasi Khan Younis: 2,000 individuals.
- Qizan Abu Rashwan to Khan Younis Town, Batin Al Samin and Mawasi Khan Younis: 250 individuals
- Al-Salam to Khan Younis town, Batin Al Samin, Mawasi Khan Younis, and South BS: 175 individuals
- Al Manara to Khan Younis town, Batin Al Samin, Mawasi Khan Younis, and Maan: 250 individuals

Observed Internal Movements within Khan Younis on April 7, 2025:

- Qarara West Salah Al Din to Mawasi Khan Younis: 1,110 individuals
- Al-Buraq (West of Al-Namso) to Unspecified destination: 425 individuals
- Al Amal to Unspecified destination: 180 individuals
- Batn As-Sameen to Unspecified destination: 155 individuals

RAFAH:

Displacement Patterns:

The entirety of the Rafah governorate is either in the buffer zone or under evacuation order. Significant displacement from Rafah has therefore occurred since the evacuation order was given on 31st of March.

Observed Internal Movements within Khan Younis on April 7, 2025:

- Rafah to South Deir al-Balah: 350 individuals
- Rafah (combined areas) to Al Mawasi: 550 individuals
