The humanitarian situation in Gaza continues to deteriorate as displacement rose since the events of March 18, 2025. The escalation, combined with displacement orders have forced residents to flee their homes, seeking refuge in overcrowded displacement sites.

This update outlines the scale, patterns, and impact of displacement in Gaza, offering insights into the ongoing humanitarian situation. Data was collected from eyewitness accounts, social media posts, and available datasets from Site Management Cluster (SMC) partners on the ground. The information was cross-referenced and analyzed to establish displacement patterns and the impact on local infrastructure.

According to OCHA, 70% of Gaza is currently either within the "no-go" areas or under displacement orders, which has increased displacement. Between 06-13 May 2025, an estimated 7,083 individuals were displaced, based on reported movements, including those following direct targeting of displacement sites during that time.
