

SUMMARY POINTS

Key updates from the Sector:

- CCCM Sector has initiated activation of CCCM structure in Syria. Two focal CCCM focal points in Aleppo and one focal point are assigned in Qamishli.
- Proposed coordination structure for whole of Syria was presented.
- According to drafted CCCM sector transition plan, national CCCM Cluster/Sector coordination in Damascus and sub-national Sector coordination structures in Aleppo and Qamishli will be established by 30 June 2025. Furthermore, CCCM engagement with local authorities on Camp management and coordination will be expanded.

Key updates from the partners

- Partners reported that they completed registration in Syria initially for 6 months. Some partners faced challenge in registration process in Homs.
- NES is hosting more than 200,000 IDPs.
- Some part of Aleppo, Hasakeh, Deir-ez zor, Rakka, and Menbij are not accessible due to ongoing conflict.

Return Movements from IDP sites

- Total number of departures from IDP sites has reached to 18,164 HHs/95,162 individuals since 6 of December 2024. Majority of IDPs have returned permanently while 10-20 % have returned temporarily.

IDP Site integrated Monitoring Matrix (ISIMM)

- As of January 2024, the CCCM database of IDP sites in Syria includes 1,736 IDP sites that host 2,187,628 Individuals/ 411,594 Households.
- Of these, 79% are women and children, and 87,666 IDPs are reported to be persons with disabilities. In January, 15 sites were deactivated due to site mergers and closures resulting from IDPs returning to their areas of origin following recent developments

Incidents Update December 2024

- In January, the CCCM Cluster reported a concerning increase in fire incidents across Idlib and Aleppo, Unfortunately, 5 fatalities were reported in al Abiad camp in Kafr Karmin due to fire incident. Another deadly fire incident took place

in Bab al Noor IDP site. Additionally, because of shooting two people were killed and 4 people were injured. Furthermore, at least 7 injuries were documented due to bombardment in Kalf Al Malaba camp in Jarablus.

Intention Survey

- Data was collected in person from **26 January to 23 February 2025**.
- REACH and CCCM partners collected data across 514 IDP sites through **4,800+ HH surveys**.
- **More than 90%** of whom reported that a member of their household had a **personal visit** to their area of origin.
- Majority of the IDP population is intending to return within 6 months while 28 percent of IDPs wants to return within 12 months.
- Main locations of intended returns are **Al Ma'ra, Idleb, Jebel Samaan Aleppo, Azaz, As-Safira, As-Suqaylabiyah, and Muhradah** districts.
- Main pull factors to return were reported as emotional desire to return, better access to employment/livelihood opportunities, better access to housing shelter, family related, and better access to basic services.
