OVERVIEW OF DISPLACEMENT MOVEMENTS

- During the week of July 15–22, three displacement orders were issued in Gaza. Notably, on July 20th, the first military displacement order since the end of the ceasefire was issued for central Deir al Balah, an area known for its high concentration of UN and NGO offices and guesthouses.
- As of July 16th, 2.1M people currently live in Gaza and **88%** of the territory is currently either within militarized areas or under displacement orders (OCHA).
- An estimated **25,238** new displacements were reported during the week of July 15-22, around 40% of known movements were intra-governorate, primarily occurring within Deir Al Balah, the remaining movements, which were inter-governorate, mainly occurred from Deir Al Balah towards Al Mawasi Khan Yunis.
- This brings the number of displacements since the escalation of military activity on May 15th to **324,995; 143,822** in the southern 3 governorates, and **181,173** in the northern 2 governorates.
- Since the end of the ceasefire on March 18th, **762,593** displacements have been recorded.

METHODOLOGY

- Data was collected from eyewitness accounts, social media posts and Site Management Cluster (SMC) partners on the ground.
- The numbers refer to displacements, and not individuals. People displace multiple times, therefore what is reported is flow figures rather than stock figures.
- Access constraints continue to pose significant challenges, impacting data quality. As a result, the majority of movements are recorded with either unknown origins or destinations.
