The humanitarian situation in Gaza continues to deteriorate as displacement rose since the events of March 18, 2025. The escalation, combined with displacement orders have forced residents to flee their homes, seeking refuge in overcrowded displacement sites.

This update outlines the scale, patterns, and impact of displacement in Gaza, offering insights into the ongoing humanitarian situation. Data was collected from eyewitness accounts, social media posts, and available datasets from Site Management Cluster (SMC) partners on the ground. The information was cross-referenced and analyzed to establish displacement patterns and the impact on local infrastructure.

According to OCHA, 83% of Gaza is currently either within militarized areas or under displacement orders, which has increased displacement. . Based on reported movements following the direct targeting of displacement sites and recent displacement orders, between the 24th of June and the 1st of July, an estimated 29,772 individuals were displaced, noting that within a 24 hour period between the 29th and 30th of June, 28,660 individuals were displaced. This brings the number of displaced individuals since the escalation of military activity on the 15th of May to 114,318 displaced individuals in the southern 3 governorates, and 162,096 displaced individuals in the northern 2 governorates.

<sup>1</sup> Estimated number of displaced individuals since 18 March, following widespread airstrikes and military displacement orders. This figure may include individuals who have been displaced multiple times during the reporting period, and therefore may be counted more than once.
