

IDP Sites Situation - Southern Syria

Highlight

- CCCM IDP site monitoring teams reported that 85 collective centers and IDP sites are currently hosting 4,827 households, comprising 23,931 IDPs displaced from Sweida. The majority, 19,981 individuals across 65 sites, are sheltering in Daraa governorate, while 3,950 individuals have relocated to rural Damascus. Notably, one collective center in Daraa hosting 98 HHs, named Kahil, has been closed after displaced families chose to move in with relatives in nearby communities.
- Over 90% of the total displacement from the AS Sweida situation continue to settle in local communities rather than IDP sites.
- The Sector and partners conducted Rapid Needs Assessments from 30 July -02 August in 76 IDP sites and collective centers, hosting the displaced population in Dar'a and Rural Damascus Governorates.

Response

- Non-Food Items (NFI) assistance has been provided fully or partially in 50% of the sites monitored by CCCM.
- WASH services are available, either fully or partially, in 67% of the monitored sites.
- Food Security and Livelihood (FSL) distributions are ongoing in 65% of the sites.
- Cash assistance has been delivered to 53 sites out of total 85 sites..
- Nutrition services are available in 44% of the sites.
- Health services are accessible in 64% of the monitored sites.
- Protection services are present in 40% of the monitored sites.

Key Needs & Gaps



water availability remains a major challenge with 69% of sites reportedly lack access to the minimum amount of water (25L/person/day).



In adequate shelter conditions in most sites, with an estimated 42% of HHs living with >5 people in one room, while shortage of NFIs, especially cooking stoves of particular concern.



Damaged WASH infrastructure was reported in most sites, with only 58% of sites meeting minimum standards for sanitation of less than 50 people to one latrine.,



Most sites are schools, creating concerns regarding the impact on Education when schools return in September.
