## OVERVIEW OF DISPLACEMENT MOVEMENTS

- As of August 12th, 2.1M people currently live in Gaza and **86%** of the territory is currently either within militarized areas or under displacement orders (OCHA).
- During the reporting period, an estimated **12,530** new displacements were reported, **68%** of which originated from Gaza governorate, with most occurring between 10 and 11 August.
- This brings the number of displacements since the escalation of military activity on May 15th to **342,760**; **152,745** in Deir al Balah, Khan Yunis, and Rafah, and **190,015** in North Gaza and Gaza
- Since the end of the ceasefire on March 18th, **780,358 displacements** have been recorded.

## METHODOLOGY

- Data was collected from eyewitness accounts, social media posts, and available datasets from Site Management Cluster (SMC) partners on the ground. The information was cross-referenced and analyzed to establish displacement patterns.
- The numbers refer to displacements, and not individuals. People displace multiple times, therefore what is reported is flow figures rather than stock figures.
- Access constraints continue to pose significant challenges, impacting data quality. As a result, the majority of movements are recorded with either unknown origins or destinations.
